

SUBJECT: Identification of United States Munitions List Items for U.S. Customs Clearance

The United States Customs Service is aggressively enforcing the provisions of 22 Code of Federal Regulations Part 126.4 which requires the identification of United States Munitions List (USML) items on Government bills of lading (GBLs) and preparation of a Shipper's Export Declaration (SED) certifying the shipment is for the exclusive end use of U.S. military forces. We have obtained a waiver from the Office of Defense Trade Controls, U.S. Department of State, to allow DoD shippers to use commercial documentation in lieu of a GBL and streamlined electronic shipment procedures for the movement of DoD USML shipments until we can implement an electronic interface between DoD transportation/shipper systems and US Customs' Automated Export System. An implementation plan has been developed and efforts are underway to accomplish the systems interfaces.

Critical to the success of this effort is the need for DoD activities requiring transportation of USML items to be able to clearly identify the item(s) to their supporting installation transportation/traffic management office. USML items are identified in the supply system by the demilitarization (DEMIL) code assigned to the item. Supply or other activities requiring transportation support must assure that the DD Form 1348-1A, DD Form 1149, or other documentation provided to the transportation/traffic management office indicates in clear text whether or not the shipment is a USML item. Where an electronic interface already exists between supply and transportation/shipper systems, the interface shall be modified to exchange this information. Web sites containing DEMIL codes and other useful customs-related information are listed at the attachment.

All DoD Components shall modify their procedures, regulations and systems to implement this requirement. This policy is effective within 90 days of the date of this memorandum.
